Scope, Purpose and Description




Students will learn how to integrate project management into the company strategy, and how to plan, schedule and manage projects. Issues covered include definition, planning, implementation, control and evaluation of the project. The course also focuses on developing the manager's ability to organize and lead project teams, and conflict resolution.
